

Batanga Local Government gives the highest portion of its budget to education (specifically girls' education) and community drinking water – **Allocative Efficiency**

The Department of Education of Arumeru Local Government carries out price survey of all contracts to be awarded; conducts quarterly monitoring of all contracts awarded; and initiates action immediately against contractors that receive 50% of their money, but have reached a performance level of less than 60% - **Operational Efficiency.**

The government of Garisa Local Government sets spending limits and insists on them – **Fiscal Discipline**

The State House of Assembly of Abyei State summons the Executive Governor of the State to answer questions of extra-budgetary spending – **Fiscal Discipline**

Departments in Arua Local Government participated in a budgetary process that enabled them to identify programs / projects of utmost importance that were accommodated within their budget limits – **Allocative Efficiency.**

A Rwandese high-ranking government official is disciplined for using money meant for Universal Basic Education textbooks to host the Minister of Education during a launching ceremony – **Operational Efficiency.**

The Zimbabwe defence sector's budget is reduced by 20% in order to increase the primary health care budget – **Allocative Efficiency.**

The government of DRC instead of spending money on an airport that will compete with another airport located in Katanga Province one hour away, decided to spend the money in linking three local governments with good road to the state-capital – **Allocative Efficiency**

The Malawian Ministry of Local Government makes sure that funds released to the different government departments are sustainable and affordable over a three-year period – **Fiscal Discipline.**

The Department of Budget in the Tanzanian Ministry of Finance collaborates with civil society organisations to monitor capital projects for which 60% of the money has been released – **Operational Efficiency.**
