
Situation


 State of affairs, condition, position, circumstances i.e the state or condition in which something, someone is at some point in time





Analysis

- A process of exploring the present conditions(or profile) of the community in relation to their natural, social economic, cultural and political environment.
- Main aim is to identify problems or issues in the community, plan to solve

- ·State in which someone or something is in at a point in time






Situational Analysis

Situational analysis:


- Study of an existing situation.
- It involves provision of information, identification of problems, creation of awareness, and facilitating better understanding through feedback, evaluation and review.
- Situational Analysis can be done on any issue e.g. educational development, health or econ. dev.







Planning Tool

 As a planning tool, it is a means of collecting information on overall contextual(socio-econ., cultural, pol. and environment of a community to gain understanding of present circumstances to enable strategic intervention



Importance

- Community dynamic better understood
- · Clarifies importance of sociocultural, pol. Econ. Conditions
- Provides space for community people to define problems affecting them, need for change



Others

- Provides information to define dev areas and project goals
- Helps in deciding appropriate activities and content of intervention
- Provides data base for monitoring

Steps in Situational Analysis

- · Identify and clearly define objectives
- Identify characteristics of the Community to be analyzed
- Determine nature & sources of information needed to understand each xteristic

Steps

- · Identify sources of collecting information
- Identify and develop techniques for collecting information
- Collect information
- · Collate, analyse information collected
- · Discuss findings, develop profile

- Identify characteristics of community







Relevant Statistics

- Economic Total annual budget, sectoral allocations, in of people employed etc
- Demographic- total population, population spread by group- men, women, boys, girls
- Population spread by religion
- Social number of married people, data on livelihood, religion
- Political- power structure in the State, analysis of the budget process

School statistics:

- Population of students/pupils- M/F
- Number of out of school children-M/F
- Number of schools
- Number of teachers-M/F
- Number of laboratories, libraries and workshops.

- What can be done to solve the problems?






Others

Format for writing situational analysis report

- Executive Summary
- Objectives (SMARTG)
- Problems/Challenges
- Introduction to analysis
- Contextual background
- Major findings
 - Demography
 - Funding- allocation & expenditure, compliance with national/international obligations, comparison with other sectors, analysis of other complimentary sectors e.g. health, youth, women; comparison with other jurisdictions ther communities, states, countries)
